

ROCK DESCRIPTION NAME GAME

1. HOW TO MAKE YOUR GAME

Cut out the rock picture cards and the rock descriptions. If you need help with scissors, ask an adult. You will have 10 rock pictures and 10 rock descriptions (20 cards in total).

2. HOW TO SET UP YOUR GAME

Separate the rock pictures from the descriptions and spread them out. Turn all the cards over so they are facing down but keep the descriptions and the pictures separate.

3. HOW TO PLAY YOUR GAME

You can play on your own or with as many people as you like. On your turn turn over a picture card and a description card. If you think that the rock picture matches the rock description, then keep them turned over. If they do not match, turn them back over and pass to the next person.

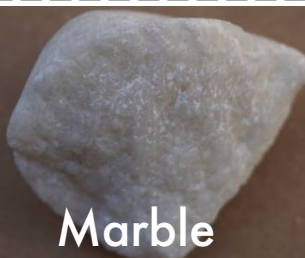

This volcanic glass is shiny, black and can have sharp edges.

Orange and looks like it's made of sugar grains. Also a common building material.

Made up of small pieces of shell. A rock that you often find fossils inside.

Smooth, white and very soft. You can draw with this rock.

Grey and shiny with large dark purple crystals of garnet.

A very light, white rock with lots of small holes. It can even float on water!

This rock is black, rough and has lots of small holes.

Grey, shiny with pink and black crystals. It has a strange name difficult to say!

A glittery white rock. It can, however, come in many different colours.
